## CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

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1. On undertaking the liability to serve abroad in time of national emergency, an officer or man of the Territorial Force will be required to sign an agreement, on Army Form E. 624, in the presence of the Officer Commanding the Territorial unit to which he belongs, and, unless notification to the contrary is given to the Commanding Officer, the liability will continue as long as the officer's or man's engagement in the Territorial Force lasts.

The engagement on Army Form E. 624, of an officer or man of the Territorial Force to accept liability for service outside the United Kingdom in time of national emergency, will be to serve with his own unit, or with a part of his own unit, only. He cannot, under this agreement, be drafted as an individual to any other unit.

3. Except as regards liability for foreign service, the conditions of the officer's or man's service in the Territorial Force will not be affected by this agreement.

4. A badge will be awarded to each individual accepting such liability for service outside the United Kingdom. This badge will be worn, when in uniform, on the right breast of the officer or man so long as the liability continues.

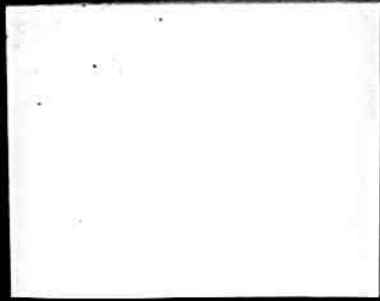

## INSTRUCTIONS as to the transmission of a Soldier's documents on transfer, posting, &c.

1. When a soldier is transferred, posted, or detached for duty for a lengthened period, his commanding officer and officer i/c records will send to his new commanding officer and officer i/c records respectively, the documents mentioned on this form. No documents will be forwarded in blank except the regimental and company conduct sheets.

2. When a soldier is attached to the permanent staff of the yeomanry the whole of his documents (excepting his original attestation and regimental conduct sheet, which will be kept by the officer i/c cavalry records), will be sent to his new commanding officer.

3. A copy of Army Form B. 279, duly filled up, will, at the same time, be sent to the officers concerned.

4. Before transmission the documents should be arranged in the sequence shown on this form and placed within it. A separate form will be prepared for each man, and in the case of a draft the forms will be arranged alphabetically. Should any document be missing, an explanation of the deficiency, signed by the commanding officer, must be substituted.

5. The statement of accounts, Army Form O. 1811 (and Army Form O. 1812, in the case of men transferred to the army reserve), will be sent as directed in the Financial Instructions.

6. When a man is transferred on probation to a departmental corps, the Army Service Corps, or the Royal Army Medical Corps, the following documents only will be forwarded, the other documents being retained until the transfer is confirmed:—

- a. Statement of accounts (Army Form O. 1811).
- b. Savings bank transfer statement.
- c. List of necessaries.
- d. Clothing return.
- e. Regimental conduct sheet.
- f. Squadron, troop, battery, or company conduct sheet.
- g. Medical history sheet.
- h. Copy of 3rd page of attestation.

7. When an army schoolmaster is moved from a home station to a station abroad, the duplicate attestation will be forwarded to the officer i/c records, War Office, in order that the necessary entries may be made in the original attestation.

The other documents specified on this form (except the list of necessaries and musketry transfer return), will be sent direct to the Commander-in-Chief in India, or to the General Officer Commanding in the Command to which the schoolmaster has been posted.

When a schoolmaster is moved from one home station to another, his documents, including duplicate attestation, will be sent direct to the officer commanding the school to which he has been posted. When moved from abroad to a home station, all the documents will be sent to the officer i/c records, War Office.

When a schoolmaster is moved from one station to another abroad, his documents, including the duplicate attestation will, if the stations are in the same command, be sent to the officer commanding the new school. If moved to a new command, or to India, they will be sent to the General Officer Commanding in the Command, or Commander-in-Chief in India.
